On **August 2&3**, at **Barb's Barn**, **Kurt Hertzog** will present a free program on sharpening and use of the skew.

Folks,

Space is limited. The sessions are open to Turners 1 and Turners 2 on a first come, first serve basis. Contact Barb Berger to set aside your space. There is no charge for either workshop, but as is the accepted practice a donation of \$5 per student per session to Barb's will be required. These donations help defray the expenses of the Barn. Bring your own lunch. As we'll break each day around noon (per the Hilburger Rule) for lunch.

Saturday, August 2nd - 9am to 3:30pm - Sharpening and Cutting Fundamentals

You'll need to bring your entire collection of tools, your grinder, and your mini-lathe. We'll cover grinding wheel selection, grinding wheel handling/balancing/truing/dressing, tool angles, shaping, sharpening, jigs and fixtures, tool steels, and more. The majority of the day will be understanding sharpening and getting all of your tools into proper shape.

Shaped at the proper angles and sharp, with you having done it! The rest of the day will reviewing and practicing (doing projects) the proper cutting techniques when your tools are ground to the proper geometry and sharp. How to avoid catches by understanding the cutting process and the various ways of using your tools.

Who should come... If you have a hard time getting your tools sharpened properly, if you have a tools that you continually get catches with, if you

want to break the bad habits you've picked up, if you are a new comer and need the fundamentals, if you want to refine you current techniques, or if you just want to pick up some tips.

Sunday, August 3rd - 9am to 3:30pm - Mastering the Skew Chisel

You'll need to bring your skew chisel(s) ready for action and your mini-lathe. If you don't have your skew(s) ready for use, see the session above. We'll spend the entire day working with the skew. You'll learn how it should be shaped, how it should be sharpened, how it can be used, what to watch out for, and more. Bring your flat skews, oval skews, round skews, big skews, small skews, and anything that can be construed as a skew. If they need to be put into shape and you can't attend the session above, bring your grinder as well and you'll learn to shape/sharpen them. Part of the day will be lecture and demonstration and the bulk of the day will be practice projects to get you plenty of skew time. You learn how to use each of the different styles of skews and how to do it as "catch free" as possible.

Who should come... If you are terrified of the skew, if you get too many catches with it, if you don't know how to use one, if you want to come and learn more about it, or if you want to pick up some tips.
