- At the September meeting, members from Make-A-Wish come to our meeting and we present them with a large check for all monies made at the Fair; they also tell us about different wishes that have been recently made and sometimes bring a child who has received a wish and his family with them and we get to hear from them how outstanding their wish was
- Aspire involvement Gene Renzoni gave us an overview:
 - Aspire used to be the Cerebral Palsy foundation and now has kids with all sorts of disabilities
 - We make and donate toys or donate stuffed animals for their annual Christmas party
 - Kids pick out their own toys at the party sometimes it is the only toy they will receive for Christmas
 - The club members and significant others are welcome to be there to join in the fun and see the joy on the kids' faces when they pick out their toy
 - There are approximately 135 children
 - The items cannot be smaller around then a toilet paper roll and must have a cured or non-toxic finish, as the kids put the toys in their mouths a lot
 - We will be looking for toys after the Fair it's never too early to start thinking of the kids!
